1 Freshmen cohorts are comprised of students that are first time in any college (FTIAC) and are enrolled full-time.

2 Retention rates are based on fall enrollment in the academic year listed and includes students enrolling at any enrollment level. Students in programs that include both undergraduate and graduate level work are included in these retention rates even if they entered the graduate portion of their program. In past years this was calculated using a different methodology, these figures may be different then previous versions of this report.

3 Students that complete their bachelor degree prior to the start of the 4th year are included as a retained student in the 4th year.

4 Graduation rates are based on the date the first bachelor degree is conferred for each student. Per the IPEDS definition a student cannot be included in the graduation rate until the degree has been conferred. Some multiple level programs do not earn the bachelor's until some point during the graduate or professional work. This rate is calculated using degrees conferred during the entire academic year, from September through August for the given year. In past years this was calculated using a different methodology, these figures may be different then previous versions of this report.

5 Attrition is the percentage of students that leave the university each year. This is based on enrollment in the fall each year, a student may re-enroll in another term during the year.

6 Average figures are the same data fields from the entire full time new freshman cohorts for the years available in the category.

7 Above the grey dashed line indicates that UDM is using the Banner database system; below the grey dashed line indicates that UDM was using the APECS database system.

8 All data is based on the census date for the given term. This data cannot be altered.
