On September 9, *U.S. News & World Report* released its annual ranking of Colleges and programs across the country. The UDM College of Business Administration's undergraduate Management program was ranked in a tie (with Rockhurst University) for 10th place, just behind Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), and ahead of many prominent institutions such as Notre Dame, Cornell University, the University of Southern California, Case Western Reserve University, Michigan State, Ohio State, Penn State, Emory University, and others. The College was also featured in the directory as one of the top undergraduate business programs in the nation.



"We're delighted to have our undergraduate Management program ranked among the top ten in the country by *U.S. News & World Report*" said Dr. Joseph G. Eisenhower, Dean of the College of Business Administration. "This achievement demonstrates that our commitment to student success, to community service, and to Jesuit and Mercy values is a winning formula that allows us to compete with any business school anywhere in the country. We've earned our reputation by focusing on three elements of education that are central to our mission: competence, compassion, and conscience. Our students not only acquire competence through first-rate technical and evaluative skills, but they also develop their consciences by studying business ethics, and practice compassion for others by undertaking service-learning and social outreach." "This national recognition is significant because it demonstrates that students can receive a world-class business education right here in Detroit. They experience outstanding faculty and academic programs, obtain internships and career opportunities at major corporations, and receive access to a truly impressive network of corporate executives who serve as mentors" Eisenhower added. *U.S. News & World Report* surveys 1,376 four-year colleges and universities around the United States based on categories created by the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching, and gathers data based on up to 16 indicators of academic excellence. The rankings are based on factors related to academic quality such as: peer assessment, student selectivity, graduation and retention rates, resources, faculty, average class size and more. The undergraduate Management program was ranked 14th in the U.S. a year earlier.

CBA Welcomes New Faculty and Staff



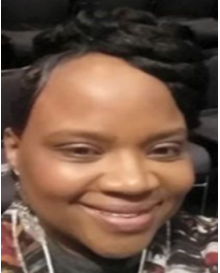
Dr. Wonseok Choi, Assistant Professor of Management

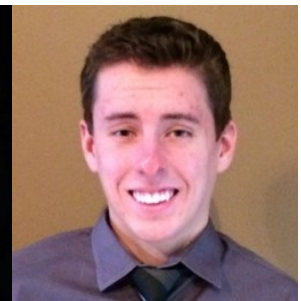
Fr. Phillip Cooke, S.J.,

The Lab is designed as an experiential learning center, where business students will receive hands-on practice with state-of-the-art business technology. The Lab features a 34-foot, color electronic ticker-tape that continuously streams stock prices, bond prices, and currency exchange rates. Other international market information can be displayed in real time on two 75-inch interactive LED video walls. 27 new, dual-monitor computers are loaded with professional-grade trading software, for the management of financial portfolios. The Financial Markets Lab will also serve to showcase the quality of our programs and facilities to visitors, and will help to recruit outstanding new students to the College.
