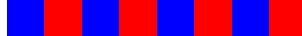

DETROIT ECONOMIC CLUB

On, Tuesday, October 19th, 2010 a group of undergraduate business students, accompanied by Dr. Michael Whitty and MBA/MSCIS student Wesley Meier, attended a Detroit Economic Club luncheon featuring Jon Wellinghoff, Chairman of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission. Chairman Wellinghoff discussed topics such as filling the tank of your car which could soon be as easy as plugging it in at night. He noted that the potential exists, today, for shifting vehicles to electric power as their primary source of energy, and using that energy to not only get drivers where they want to go, but to support and enhance the opera-

tion of the nation's electric grid. Wellinghoff also outlined the challenge of developing the vehicles and batteries and building a 21st Century transmission grid that, together, could revolutionize how Americans live and work.

Another group of UDM business students, accompanied by Dr. Omid Sabbaghi, attended the Detroit Economic Club meeting on October 22, 2010. The students, sponsored by the Rehmann group, had the opportunity to discuss real-world economic and financial issues with several CEOs. The meeting focused on initiatives that could transform Michigan's economy. Investments in infrastructure, higher education, and urban

development were discussed in significant detail. The CEOs in attendance were Michael J. Jandernoa of the Perrigo Company, James B. Nicholson of PVS Chemicals Inc., and Sandra E. Pierce of Charter One, Michigan. Stephen Henderson of the Detroit Free Press moderated a panel discussion with the CEOs.

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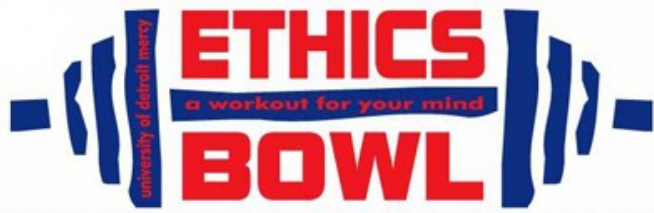
ETHICS BOWL RESULTS

FAULTY PUBLICATION & ACTIVITY

Gerald Cavanagh published, “Markets Organize Our Lives,” in *Journal of Jesuit Business Education* (summer, 2010). He chaired a session at the Academy of Management international conference in Montreal in August, “A Global Perspective on Corporate Social Responsibility: CSR Outside the United States.” Father Cavanagh presented a paper, “Jesuit Higher Education in

Business,” to the deans of the Jesuit business schools at St. Joseph’s University, Philadelphia in October, and he gave two presentations at the Colleagues in Jesuit Business Education meeting at Marquette University in July, “Orientation to Jesuit Business Education,” and “Jesuit Higher Education in business”. Both were with co-authors from other universities. Father Cavanagh has
